

Living Water

Here we are in 2024 with a new year ahead of us again. While most people will be thinking about revitalising their health or bank balance after Christmas in 2024 as a church community we are going to be thinking about revitalising our parishes and church community. Seeking God's living water in our communities.

This is part of a wider project that the church is involved with called Living Christ's Story. With the Bishop and PCCs support and guidance I will be attending some revitalise workshops on behalf of the parish to share questions and learning with other parishes going through the same process.

As part of this project there will be space for all of us to be involved and key people will be included in the workshops. It's not formal training as such but more of a support network for people involved in changing how we seek to serve God in our community.

There are a few key themes to focus on that we can all engage with and we will be exploring these together. One key priority is called 'Reaching people we currently don't' and this could mean younger people and children as well as other friends and family who don't come to church. As we are aware this is a challenge in our world today.

We are lucky though in our benefice to be able to offer different ways to meet with God across our three churches. We also have lots of opportunities to share the gospel outside of church too. I am so thankful for all the hard work going on already through different groups to connect with the local community.

We are starting the process of planning this together in February and please do get in touch if you have ideas or concerns about this. We will share more details about how to get involved as things progress.

Perhaps in the meantime this is a helpful verse to ponder as we contemplate the challenges and opportunities ahead...

The Hull Youth Faith and Community Project, formerly Hull Youth for Christ, operates in the Boulevard, Hessle Rd area of Hull, one of the most deprived

wards in the country. It has a proud history linked to the deep-sea fishing community of Hull but now has many social problems including exploitation, poverty, drugs, abuse, crime and poverty. It is an area that I know well having started my career there 61 years ago. Despite the many problems there is some terrific community work there thanks to committed Christians Iona and Ian Dyson who with other volunteers choose to live with and serve the community through the above project. We have established links with them, and they both addressed the congregation of Elloughton and Brough at All Saints on Sunday 29 October. The project has varied themes but despite the change of name faith in Christ stays firmly at the centre of their work.

A key feature of their mission involves running a 'Breakfast Club' for children (and their families if required) on each weekday of the school term between 8.0 am and 8.45 am in the hall of a Boulevard church. This is attended by 70 plus children and in some cases other family members every day. They offer a choice of cereals along with toast etc and drinks but particularly Weetabix, Cornflakes, Rice Krispies and fruit juices. All the food is donated by volunteers or the members of the team but such is the demand that they ALWAYS need much more. In addition to the breakfast activity other counselling and support is on hand to help families face their difficulties. The Breakfast Club is welcomed by all the local schools as children are settled and not hungry when they attend at 9: 00 am and consequently behaviour is improved.

Elloughton, Brough and Brantingham have supported the Hull Food Bank now for several years which has been splendid. This must continue but could we ask that donations of cereals and fruit drinks also be donated for YFC through the usual collection points? I would ensure that donations are delivered promptly to YFC in the Boulevard. Efforts are also being made to ask the local supermarket on Hessle Road to support the project.

Iona and Ian Dyson will again visit All Saints Brough on Thursday 1 February for the Coffee Morning which will be in aid of the project. They will give a short address on their work and answer any questions. I cannot stress enough the value of their efforts and the difference they make to that community which is only 12 miles away from our parishes.
